




Following the watch party, on Tuesday 28th January, the film will be made available to anyone who has made the suggested £5 donation via ParentPay.






Thank you to all the staff and students who stayed late to ensure that the event ran smoothly. Student Leaders—you did a great job!
















Ms Brindley - UK Parliament Teacher Ambassador

It's a really great achievement to have been selected from nearly 200 applicants, and we wish the boys the best for all their training and fixtures. Here they are at their first session.






Artist of the Week






Well done to Year 10 student Neve for her delicate and creative ink studies of pebble forms. These are beautifully observed!


