





- Yellow Fever In order to enter the country each traveller must have a yellow fever certificate of vaccination - approx. £60 - £75
- 2. Rabies approx. £70 £100 per dose (typically 3 given)
- 3. Men ACWY (covers multiple strains of meningitis) approx. £55
- 4. Typhoid approx. £35
- 5. Hepatitis A and B Free on NHS if you get it done early enough otherwise approx. £50 per vaccine dose
- 6. Polio, tetanus, diphtheria- Free on NHS if required
- 7. Antimalarials Malarone is the most popular medication. Supermarket equivalent tablets are a cheaper source.



Medication

We don't need to take in medication unless students need support in taking it, or are worried it will be lost or forgotten (for instance antibiotics which need to be taken with every meal).

Students should carry some Antimalarials in their hand luggage, and some in their main luggage. If they lose any of it they should let us know immediately.

It's best to take the first 'Malerone' (if taking that type) on the day we leave at 9am, we then remind students every morning to take it.

We do need to know what medication they are taking in case of emergency so please include everything on the medical record form.

Deet vs Smidge

N,N-Diethyl-m-toluamide.

DEET interferes with neurons and receptors located on the mosquito's antennae and mouth-parts that detect chemicals such as lactic acid and carbon dioxide.

When applied correctly, DEET forms a vapor barrier at the skin surface that deters mosquitoes from landing on the skin.





Picaridin (also known as Saltidin)

Piperine (a derivative of piperidine) is what gives pepper its pungent smell.

Picaridin both repels and deters insects. This means that insects move away from skin or clothing treated with Picaridin and do not feed if they encounter skin or clothing that has been treated. When applied correctly, Picaridin forms a vapor barrier at the skin surface that deters mosquitoes from landing on the skin.

Other products are available, but in our experience they are not as effective.

Health & Safety Key Messages

- Always carry a small pot of sun cream
- Keep hydrated, keep your water bottle clean
- Wear appropriate clothing and don't spend too long out in the sun
- Hand sanitise/wash hands frequently (beware of toilet handles / bank notes etc)
- Use only filtered or bottled water for brushing your teeth
- Mosquitos: anti-malarial tablets/spray and long sleeves especially in the evenings
- Avoid walking in long grass unless you have boots on (snakes/jiggers)
- Avoid picking up things from the ground/bush
- Don't touch the animals
- Safari there are wild animals around, even around the hotel grounds
- Swimming pools have no life guard

- Limited working seat belts, be sensible when travelling
- Keep elbows / arms / heads inside the vehicle
- No standing up while safari vehicle is moving
- Keep valuables and money hidden (this is also cultural, it is considered rude to flash the cash!)
- Giving things out / being asked for things always be aware that Ugandans have very little and you may have to be practiced at saying no.
- Take care around topics of conversation: religion, LGBTQ, politics
- Be a bit guarded talking to strangers, although Ugandans are super friendly

We are monitoring the current situation and hopeful that it is contained very soon.

Today the World Health Organization (WHO) said there are now seven cases of Ebola Sudan in Uganda's capital, Kampala, up from two a couple of days ago. The updated case numbers were presented during a WHO Information Network for Epidemics webinar, according to the infectious disease tracking forum FluTrackers.

The index case-patient was a 32-year-old male nurse who developed symptoms on January 19. He died 10 days later, with tests confirming Ebola Sudan. The second patient in the outbreak is the nurse's wife. So far 298 contacts of the couple have been identified, with 7 confirmed cases. The WHO said there are two main clusters in the outbreak: a family cluster and a healthcare facility cluster. There are no further details on the healthcare facility cases, but the index patient visited a traditional healer and three separate health clinics before he died in Kampala.

Only the index patient has died, leaving the case-fatality rate (CFR) at 14.3%.

Uganda has launched a trial of a vaccine against the Sudan strain of the Ebola virus, following an outbreak in the country that has killed one person and infected two others.

The first patient, a 32-year-old male nurse, died last week.

On Monday, the initial participant in the trial, who is currently in isolation, received a dose of the vaccine, which was developed by the International Aids Vaccine Initiative, a global non-profit organisation.

There is currently no approved vaccine for the Sudan strain of Ebola. One does exist, however, for the Zaire strain, which has been prevalent in the past in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

It is transmitted through contact with infected bodily fluids and tissues.

Uganda is currently experiencing its sixth outbreak of the disease.

Forty contacts of the first victim of this outbreak will be vaccinated in this phase of the roll-out jointly conducted with the Ugandan authorities and the WHO, the UN agency said in a statement on Monday. Uganda's health ministry has confirmed 234 contacts as listed for monitoring.


Politics in Uganda.

Uganda is essentially a police/army state, although there are elections there is a big divide between the older generation who remember Idi Amin (estimates suggest the dictator was responsible for up to 500,000 deaths in Uganda) and Museveni as a liberating war hero - and the younger generation who want an end to corruption and human rights violations. This can lead to riots/demonstrations in election years.

Don't take pictures of policemen/the military and it is polite to avoid political conversations.

We may get stopped by police at road checks – it is normal, fines are issued very regularly for all sorts of reasons!








Tribes in Uganda.

Uganda has around 56 tribes who speak different languages and have their own different dress codes and cultures.

Uganda also has a number of Indigenous Peoples including ancient communities of hunters and gatherers, such as Benet and Batwa, also known as Twa. They also include minority groups like the Ik, the Karamojong and the Basongora.

English is recognised as an official language as is Swahili, most schools teach in English. Luganda is the local language widely spoken in the areas we visit.



Ugandans dress very smartly.



In cities, women can wear a calf-length skirt, though trousers are acceptable.

Local women in rural areas mostly wear ankle-length skirts or dresses, but again, foreign women can get away with calf-length skirts or trousers.

Ugandan men almost always wear long pants, and shorts generally are seen as only for schoolboys.

Dress codes

For travelling there (and back):

Used clothing from the West is a big seller in East Africa. Uganda's leader wants a ban

The Owino Market in Uganda's capital has long been a go-to enclave for rich and poor people alike looking for affordable but quality-made used clothes, underscoring perceptions that Western fashion is superior to what is made at home

Despite the popularity, secondhand clothes are facing increasing pushback. Ugandan President Yoweri Museveni, a semi-authoritarian leader who has held power since 1986, declared in August that he was banning imports of used clothing, saying the items are coming "from dead people."

"When a white person dies, they gather their clothes and send them to Africa." Museveni said.

Baggage Allowance

Uganda – Turkish Airlines

Checked Baggage:

2 pieces (23kg/50lb each) (for as few of your clothes and as many donations as possible - we will help you pack).

Maximum dimensions*The length + width + height should not exceed 158cm (by piece)

Maximum weight: A single piece of checked-in baggage should weigh no more than 23kg (70lb)

In addition to the regular checked-in baggage allowance you may carry, you may also bring along hand baggage on board the cabin during your Turkish Airlines flight: This is important – you need to maximise this.

Economy Class customers are allowed to carry one piece of baggage, not to exceed 8kg (15lb)

Baggage guidelines

Maximum dimensions for each piece of hand baggage are 23x40x55cm (20x15x10in)

In addition to your hand baggage allowance, you can also carry personal items such as one lady's handbag or one small briefcase; one coat, cape or blanket; one small camera or binoculars; limited reading material; duty-free items purchased on the day of your flight. This personal item must not exceed 4kg in weight and 40x30x15 in dimension.

Liquids and gels in hand baggage

You may carry liquids, gels, pastes and aerosols in containers up to 100ml. Your containers should be carried in a transparent, resealable, quart- or litre-sized bag no larger than 20x20cm (8x8in). Please ensure all items fit comfortably in the plastic bag.

Airport security will ask you to produce your transparent bag of liquids separately for screening. Consider packing all personal electronic devices that you do not intend to use in-flight into your check-in baggage.

Drop off at school between 00:00 and 00:30 – students and parents should come up the main reception of the building where staff will be based:


- Hand luggage not left at school will be checked and weighed and loaded onto the coach.





Money:

We are insured up to £1000 cash per person

In order to make sure students money is secure staff will collect in student money not needed for the journey and open a bank balance in the bank book.

All staff will then carry any UK Stirling in money belts and convert into UGX when we get there.

There is a maximum limit of cash we can take out of the UK and into Uganda so the recommended amount for students is around £150 spending money for gifts and snacks in Uganda (they can bring less) and £30 for food on the journey to and from the airport.

Students can make 'bank' withdrawals each day from the designated staff member.

Street food is very cheap in Uganda (between 5p and 50p) but western items such as biscuits, Pringles and sweets can be very expensive (a milkshake at the Safari lodge costs around £5)

Supermarket prices in Uganda are fixed – but everything else is negotiable!

You will likely be charged around double the minimum price someone would be prepared to accept at a market, especially tourist craft ones.



Valuables:

Many Ugandans think all foreigners are rich.

Just the fact that we have the money to fly to Uganda in the first place makes us richer than many Ugandans could ever hope to be.

We are insured for phones/valuables however:

Be aware that Ugandans are very polite and handle cash very discreetly (rolled up in the palm of their hand).

The school children that we visit may have meat as part of a meal two or three times a year, and will have a soda once a year probably at Christmas.

It isn't fair to put very poor young people around electronics and valuables that they would never normally have access to, so we don't allow Ugandan children in bedrooms.


