

Just before the half-term break, a group of our adventurous students embarked on an unforgettable trip to Iceland, immersing themselves in the country's awe-inspiring landscapes, rich geological wonders, and fascinating culture. From steaming hot springs to thundering waterfalls, the journey was packed with exploration and discovery.

After a 12-hour journey from Kernow to Keflavík, our students wasted no time in embracing Iceland's unique geothermal wonders. A relaxing visit to the geothermal swimming baths provided the perfect start, followed by a delicious buffet dinner to refuel after a long day of travel.

Over the next few days students enjoyed trips out to Iceland's best sites and were treated to an aurora borealis display of a lifetime!

The group set off on the famous Golden Circle route, a highlight-packed journey featuring some of Iceland's most iconic natural wonders. They witnessed the explosive power of geysers, marveled at breathtaking waterfalls, and even indulged in





traditional Icelandic ice cream at a local dairy farm—an unexpected but much-appreciated treat!

A visit to Reykjavik, Iceland's vibrant capital, offered students the opportunity to explore the city's charm and culture. The trip also included an educational stop at the Perlan Museum, where interactive exhibits brought glaciers, volcanoes, and Icelandic wildlife to life in an immersive experience.

Our geographers trekked to Hveragerði's famous natural hot springs, where they observed bubbling pools reaching temperatures of 36°C to 40°C. They then visited the Hellisheiði Power Station, learning how Iceland harnesses its immense geothermal energy to become a world leader in sustainable power.


No trip to Iceland would be complete without a chance to witness the breathtaking Northern Lights. Braving the chilly night, students waited in anticipation for the northern lights to dance across the sky—and the spectacular display was certainly worth the early wake-up call!

The adventure continued with visits to Iceland's rugged coastlines, imposing glaciers, and dynamic river systems. The students saw first-hand the impact of glacial retreat and powerful waves shaping the landscape, making their geography lessons come to life in the most thrilling way.

From start to finish, the Iceland 2025 trip was an unforgettable experience, leaving students with lasting memories and a deeper appreciation for the incredible forces that shape our planet. 



The project began with students identifying the most relevant and interesting topics, followed by inviting interviewees and preparing insightful questions. The second stage saw them setting up a studio, filming





### Eco Club visit Cornwall Energy Recovery Centre

n Tuesday 25th of February a group of students visited the 'Cornwall Energy Recovery Centre' to explore what happens to any waste that cannot be recycled in Cornwall.


During the day, students enjoyed completing quizzes in the interactive visitor space and got to see the main 'control centre' where screens full of data are constantly updated, helping monitor levels of gases emitted from the incinerator. They even watched 'the claw' in action, picking up our waste and moving it to the next stage of the process.

The Cornwall energy recovery centre exports around 20 megawatts of electricity – enough for 21,000 homes!









Students were also keen to find out what happens to the 'ash' and discovered that this waste product is used in road building! Staff at the site spoke to students about the waste hierarchy, reminding them that the 'recovery' stage is the last resort, instead we should all be trying to 'reduce' our waste to ensure a more sustainable future.

The school Eco-club is focussing on reducing waste this term, and hence, this visit was extremely valuable. Many thanks to the knowledgeable staff at the facility who delivered such an engaging day for our students. Thanks also to the students who were an absolute credit to the school community.


